

Hesse is one of Germany's largest and most financially sound states. Its GDP was over 350 billion euros in 2023. The Hessian Ministry of Finance (HMdF), headquartered in the state capital of Wiesbaden, is the state's supreme authority when it comes to managing budgetary funds. Among other duties, the Hessian Ministry of Finance is responsible for fiscal and tax policies, state financing assistance, and settling revenue sharing between Hesse and the federal government. Subordinate organizations to the HMdF include Oberfinanzdirektion (Inland Revenue Office) Frankfurt and the Hessian tax offices, the Hessian Competence Center für neue Verwaltungssteuerung, (Competence Center for New Administration Management), Landesbetrieb Bau und Immobilien Hessen (the state's construction and real estate authority), and the Studienzentrum für die Finanzverwaltung und Justiz (a study center for financial administration and the judiciary). In total, the Hessian Ministry of Finance has a staff of around 16,000 across 47 locations.

The Hessian Ministry of Finance has recognized the key importance of modern, proactive personnel management. It recruits actively on the market and offers extensive employee benefits such as child allowances, infant care, and holiday programs for schoolchildren, as well as state-wide public transportation passes and flexible work models. ### **Customer pain points**

Against this backdrop, the Hessian Ministry of Finance subjected its existing training system to an intensive analysis. The result: The existing system no longer matched either the flexible work models or the ministry's aspirations as a pioneer in the public sector. In 2022, the Hessian Ministry of Finance launched a tender for a digital learning platform, setting the course for a modern learning system that focuses on the personal needs of employees and makes training as flexible as working. The new training system had to offer classic seminar management and eLearning alike, along with multimedia integration and a user-friendly design with gamification elements. An extensive authorization and role concept had to enable talent management, with assignment to a "pillars of competence" model. Workflow support was needed to create and archive tests and certificates automatically.



## **How T-Systems solved it**
